provided also, that all that part of said precincts lying between said alley and a line drawn parallel with said alley, at a distance of one hundred feet therefrom, that is to say, a line beginning at a point on the side of the road leading from said alley to the steam mill bridge, at the distance of one hundred feet from said alley, and running southward and parallel with the said alley the whole extent of said alley, shall be as liable to the said acts and its supplements as the western precincts have heretofore been."

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order

a third time, and passed with the proposed amendment.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the Senate took up for consideration, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Charity Alderson and William C. Alderson; the bill having been read a third time, the question was put, shall the bill pass? Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the Senate reconsidered the said

bill.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the said bill was then re committed.

Mr Thomas from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of John Contee Keith.

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Heath from the committee, made an unfavorable report upon the bill, entitled, an act relating to the summoning of jurors in Baltimore city.

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Heath from the committee to whom was referred, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Henry Davis, and Caroline M. Davis, of the city of Bakimore, reported the same with the following amendment, viz.—

Amendment proposed:

Add the following proviso to the bill.

"Provided nevertheless, That nothing in this act contained shall operate or be construed to render the issue of the said John Davis, and the said Caroline Matilda Davis, born during their coverture aforesaid, illegitimate."

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second time.

The house adjourned until to-morrow mouning 10 o'clock.
