

SATURDAY, February 19, 1831.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, *An act to authorise a subscription to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company*; the bill, entitled, *An act to incorporate the Port Deposit Library Company*; and the bill, entitled, *A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Princess-Anne, in Somerset county, severally passed by the senate yesterday*; the bill, entitled, *An additional supplement to an act to amend the Lottery system, rejected by the senate on the same day*, the resolution requiring the commissioners of the school fund for Calvert county, to make an annual report to the legislature of the manner of distributing said fund; the resolution in favour of Maria Gambrill; the resolution in favour of Stephen Hafley, a revolutionary soldier; the resolution in favour of Gassaway Pindell, adm'r. of Nicholas Pindell, deceased; the resolution in favour of Anna M. Smyth; and the resolution in favour of the trustees of the Abingdon academy, in Harford county; severally assented to by the senate on the same day, were returned to the house of delegates. The message relative to returning to the house of delegates the bill to authorise a subscription to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company; and the message relative to an adjournment of the legislature, were sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the engrossed bill, entitled, *An act to promote internal improvement, by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington*, was read a third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Thomas, from the committee on ways and means, made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, *An additional supplement to the act of December session 1827, chapter 117, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others.*

The said bill was then read a second time.
