Mr. Sewell from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act empowering the commissioners of Harford county to build a bridge over Winter's Run, in said county, at or near the place where the road leading from Gunpowder Neck to Belle-Air crosses said run.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favour of Martin Bourke, of Washington county, was read a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favour of Thomas Osbourne, late sheriff and collector of Prince-George's county, was read the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Smith from the committee made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act empowering the levy courts of Harford and Baltimore counties to build a bridge over the Little Gunpowder Falls at the Rock Ford.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of de-

legates

Mr Forrest from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to extend the time of taking appeals from the chancery court in a certain case therein mentioned, with the following amendment, viz.

Amendment proposed.

In the 7th line of the first section strike out the words either of the parties to said case may," and insert in lieu thereof the following: "it shall and may be lawful for Nicholas Snowden, and his wife, and Isaac Knight, and his wife, or either of them, or the heirs or representative of either of them, to"

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Thomas, the resolution in favour of Jonas Green was read a third time by special order, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kennedy submitted the following resolution; which was read the first, and by special order a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, and having been engrossed, was then, on motion of Mr. Kennedy, read the third time by special order, assented to, and sent to the hoise of delegates.
