The bill, entitled, An act to repeal a part of an act passed at December session 1829, chapter 106, and for other purposes, was read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act of December session 1827, chapter 117, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others, was read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the resolution relating to the several clerks, sheriffs and collectors of this state. The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Rees, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate certain persons therein mentioned, for the purpose of establishing a school called The Liberty Grove School, in Cecil county.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of John Contee Keith, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to the free school fund, was read a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled, An additional act relating to the city of Baltimore, reported the same with the following amendments, viz:
