

mayor and city council, to impose and raise in any one year, by direct taxation, a sum exceeding one hundred and twenty thousand dollars; or impose and raise in any one year from direct taxation, and all other sources of taxation, a sum exceeding two hundred and twenty thousand dollars.

Number the succeeding, now the 3d section, as the 5th section of the bill.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That the debts which the mayor and city council of Baltimore may contract on behalf of said city, shall not in the aggregate at any time exceed the sum of one million of dollars, including as a part of said sum, whatsoever amount the said city may now owe.

Which amendments were read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed with the proposed amendments, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Forrest from the committee made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the appointment of constables in this state, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1824, chapter 140.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favour of Gassaway Pindell was read a third time, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act supplementary to an act for the opening of Pratt-street, passed at December session 1828, chapter 88, with the following amendments, viz.

Amendments proposed.

In the 4th line of the first section, after the word "all," insert the following words: "the wharves belonging to the state and connected with the."

Strike out the second section.

Which amendments were read and assented to.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed with the proposed amendments.

Mr. Heath from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to regulate fees on executions.
