

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, *An act relating to the recording of certain proceedings in Baltimore county court*, was read a third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Forrest, the bill, entitled, *An act to distribute the school fund of Montgomery county*, was taken up for consideration, read a third time, and the question put, *Shall the bill pass?* On this question the yeas and nays being asked for, were taken and appeared as follows:

So the bill was rejected.

Mr. Kennedy from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, *An act to authorise and empower commissioners to open and extend the breadth of an alley in Westminster, in Frederick county.*

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the amendments proposed by the house of delegates to the bill, entitled, *An act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a railroad from Baltimore to the city of Washington*, were read a second time and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favour of Susanna Brewer, widow of Thomas Brewer, a revolutionary soldier; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a resolution authorising the governor to draw upon the treasurer for such sum as may be sufficient to carry into effect the provisions of a resolution passed at the present session, providing for the appointment of commissioners to go to Harrisburg upon the subject of obstructions in the Susquehanna river; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on ways and means.
