The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and dissented from.

Mr. Heath from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Garrett Smith, of the city of Baltimore.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed.

Mr. Heath from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Peter Johnson, of the city of Baltimore.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the engrossed bill, entitled, An act to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county to levy and assess a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, was read a third time by special order and passed.
