The bill entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others, passed at December session 1827; and the bill, entitled, An act to distribute the school fund of Montgomery county; severally rejected by the senate on the same day. The resolution in favour of Richard Ridgely; the resolution in favour of John Quinn and Andrew Slicer; the resolution in favour of Joseph Wicks 4th; and the resolution in favour of Standish Barry, severally assented to by the senate on the same day; and the resolution in favour of Susanna Brewer, widow of Thomas Brewer, a revolutionary soldier, rejected by the senate on the same day, were returned to the house of delegates. The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county to levy and assess a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, and the bill, entitled, An act to restrain and punish certain evil practices, severally passed by the senate on the same day, were sent to the house of delegates. The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the dispatch of business in Frederick county court, passed at December session 1829, chapter 107, passed by the senate on the same day, was returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favour of John Hamilton, a revolutionary soldier, was read a third time, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sewell from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill relating to the commissioners of Harford and Baltimore counties.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Smith from the committee on ways and means, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to provide for enforcing the collection of penalties incurred under existing resolutions of this state.

The said bill was then read a second time.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.
