On motion of Mr. Smith, the senate reconsidered the bill mentioned in the said message, and it was recommitted.

And also returned the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the despatch of business in Baltimore county court, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment," viz.

Amendment proposed.

And the following section to the bill:

And be it enacted, That for the purpose of providing the amount of compensation intended to be secured by an act passed at December session 1828, chapter 127, there shall be paid to the clerk of Baltimore county court, over and above all fees at present demandable by law, and in addition to the fees prescribed by the eighth section of an act passed at December session 1828, chapter 161, the sum of one dollar each, by every insolvent debtor residing in the city of Baltimore, on the day limited for his appearance before the said court for a final hearing on every execution, or writ in the nature thereof, at the time of taking out the same, fifty cents; on every judgment entered on verdict, confession, requisition, default, or non pross, by the party against whom such judgment may be given 25 cents; on every *feri facias* on judgment or against bail 50 cents; on every condemnation entire or upon any attachments against property at the time of entering security on such condemnation 50 cents; on the granting of every appeal bond 25 cents; on each petition for an insolvent debtor for an extension of the time of his appearance 50 cents; to be paid at the time of filing said petition, and the bond of the clerk of said court shall be answerable therefor; and it shall be the duty of the said clerk to account for and pay over quarterly, all money by him so received, to the treasurer of the western shore, retaining only a commission at the rate of five per centum for his trouble in receiving and paying the said money, according to this act, and the treasurer of the western shore shall apply the money so received to the provisions of the act in this section first mentioned, and in such manner as that all arrearages of compensation shall be paid, and deficiencies therein that may have accrued, or hereafter shall occur in any year, may be paid out of the excess of the receipts of any other year or years if there be any such receipt.
