

Mr. Harrison from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in Queen-Anne's county

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee on insolvent debtors, made an unfavourable report upon the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors.

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Thomas from the committee on ways and means, made a favourable report upon the resolution in favour of Henry Wayman.

The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee to which was referred the petition of Adolphus Sicard, praying for an act of insolvency, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion the prayer thereof ought not to be granted, and that the petitioner have leave to withdraw his petition.

Which report was read and concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish pilots, and regulate their fees, was read a third time, and the question put, Shall the bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:
