Determined in the affirmative. So the senate ordered the bill to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Dennis submitted the following order; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Ordered, That the governor be requested to cause to be published immediately after the end of this session, twice in three of the newspapers printed in Baltimore, and in one newspaper published in Annapolis, and in one of the Eastern newspapers, the act, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to prevent unnecessary accumulation of costs on all actions or suits at law in the county courts of this state, passed at December session 1829, chapter 116.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to coroners holding inquests, was read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Frederick-town Savings Institution. The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and the question put, Shall the bill pass?
