The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of M. A. Ringgold and children; the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Franklin Turnpike Road Company, passed at December session 1827, chapter 186; and the bill, entitled, An act to provide for the purchase of the office papers formerly belonging to the surveyor's office of Frederick county, and to repeal an act therein mentioned, severally passed by the senate yesterday; the bill, entitled, An act relating to coroners holding inquests; the hill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Frederick Town Savings Institution; and the bill, entitled, An act to divorce Anna Collins, and her husband Greenberry Collins, of the city of Baltimore, severally rejected by the senate on the same day, and the resolution relative to the Cumberland road, rejected by the senate on the same day, were returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act to prevent the unnecessary accumulation of costs in civil suits; the bill, entitled, An act to prevent unnecessary expense and delay in prosecuting appeals from courts exercising equity jurisdiction in this state; and the bill, entitled, An act relating to the jail of Baltimore city and county, severally passed by the senate on the same day; the message relative to the bill to restrain attorneys and solicitors in chancery from entering their appearance to any suit, bill, or action at law or in equity in the courts of this state without special authority, and the message relative to the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act for the better regulation of apprentices, with the bills to which they severally relate, were sent to the house of delegates.
