Mr. Mayer, from the committee appointed to examine the proceedings of the electors of the senate, reported that the committee had examined the same, and that it appears that the electors assembled at Annapolis on the nineteenth day of September, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty one, and duly elected as senators the following gentlemen:— Octavius C. Taney, Bene S. Pigman, Benjamin S. Forrest, Charles F. Mayer, Thomas Sappington, James Montgomery, William T. Wootton, Dennis Claude, and John G. Chapman, for the western shore:—and George Reid, Thomas Emory, Henry Page, Littleton P. Dennis, Samuel G. Osborn and William Hughlett, for the eastern shore.

With regard to the election of Mr. Page, your committee would state that at the time of his being chosen by the electors, he was a member of the executive council, a circumstance, however, which the committee does not think rendered him ineligible for the station of senator. The soundness of this conclusion is, nevertheless, submitted to the consideration of the senate; which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The Senate adjourned until to morrow morning, 10 o'clock.

THURSDAY, December 29, 1831.
