

ferred, read, and unanimously assented to, to wit: Add the following as a proviso to the bill, "provided nevertheless, that rights acquired by other persons since issuing of said warrant, shall not be affected by any thing in this act. The question was then put, "shall the bill pass?" it was determined in the affirmative; and the bill was sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, leave was given to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act allowing the Sheriff of Somerset county further time to execute his official bond. Ordered, that Messrs. Dennis, Osborne and Pigman, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The clerk of the House of Delegates, delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act, for the benefit of William B. Burk of the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on insolvency.

A bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, for the relief of John Norris and Caleb Pue of Harford county, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Judicial proceedings.

A bill, to authorise John Kinzer, Henry Henning and Solomon Sailor, trustees named in a certain deed, from John Wanphler or their successors, to build a suitable house on the lot therein conveyed for the residence and accommodation of a teacher, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Saopington, Wootton and Taney.

Mr. Pigman, from the committee to which it had been referred, reported favorably on a bill, entitled an act for the benefit of William B. Burk, of the city of Baltimore, which was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee to which the leave had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, extending the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Somerset county, which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading. It was accordingly engrossed, and on motion, read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Taney, from the committee to which it had been referred, reported favorably on the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Joseph Wood, former Sheriff of Calvert county, which was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, the resolutions relative to the Southern and Western boundaries of this State, were read
