SATURDAY, January 7th, 1832.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled an act, for the benefit of Asahel Hussey and others, passed by the Senate on yesterday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Hughlett, presented the petition of the Stockholders of the Choptank Bridge Company, which was read and referred to Messrs. Hughlett, Dennis and Chapman.

The resolution in favor of John Greenwood, of Frederick county, was read the third time and assented to.

The clerk of the House of Delegates, delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Doctor William G. McElhenny of Harford county, to hire out certain negroes, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Osborn, Chapman and Sappington.

A bill to revive and continue in force, an act entitled, an act to preserve the side walks in Union-Town, in Frederick county, passed December session, 1830, chapter 2; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Dennis and Hughlett; and returned the following bills: which originated in the Senate, severally endorsed, "will pass."

A bill, entitled, an act to extend the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Somerset county, and

A bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of Reuben Worthington of Allegany county.

Mr. Hughlett, from the committee to which the petition had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate a company for erecting a Bridge over Choptank River, at, or near Dover Ferry, which was read the first time.
