The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the toi-

lowing resolutions:

A resolution requesting the Senators and Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, to use their exertions to procure appropriations for the establishment and support of proper Buoys at the entrances of the Rivers Nanticoke, Manokin, Annamassisc, Pocomoke and Wicomico in the collection districts of Snowhill and Vienna; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Reid and Montgomery.

A resolution, requesting the Senators and Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, to use their exertions to procure appropriations for the erection of Light houses on Hooper's or Barns' Island, in Dorchester county, and on Sharp's Island, in Talbot county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Hugh-

lett and Taney.

Also, the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Wheeling Transportation Company; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Chapman and Sapping-

Mr. Mayer, from the committee on Judicial proceedings, to which had been referred the bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act for the relief of John Norris and Caleb Pue, of Harford county, reported, that the committe had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass; it was then read a second time.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which had been recommitted the bill, entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road within the limits of the State of Maryland, reported, that the committee had had the subject again under consideration, and had ininstructed him to report another bill, entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road within the limits of the State of Maryland; which was read the first time.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee to which it had been referred, a bill, entitled, an act to authorise Doctor William McElhenny, of Harford county, to hire out certain negroes, reported favorably thereon; the bill was then read a second time.
