

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise Doctor William I. McElhenny of Harford county, to hire out certain negroes, which was passed by the Senate on yesterday, was returned; And the

Preamble and resolutions relative to re-chartering the United States Bank, also assented to by the Senate on yesterday, was sent to the house of delegates

Mr. Dennis from the committee on Invalid deeds, to which was referred a resolution in favor of Anne Evans, of the State of New-York, reported favorably thereon; it was then read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise John Kinzer, Henry Herring and Solomon Sailor, Trustees, named in a certain deed from John Wamphler or their successors, to build a suitable house on the lot therein conveyed for the residence and accommodation of a teacher; was read the third time as amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Robert C. Lushy, former sheriff of Cecil county, was read the third time, and the question was put, "shall the bill pass?" It was determined in the negative, and the bill was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman presented the petition of Frisby Tilghman, Sen. and John R. Dale, of Washington county, and David Lynn and Anna B. Tilghman of Allegany county, praying certain relief for the heirs of George Tilghman, late of Washington county; deceased; which was read and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Emory and Sappington.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed from Abel Pearson and wife, to John Andrews, was recommitted to the committee on invalid deeds.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery, the bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Harford county court to record the deeds therein mentioned, was recommitted to the committee on invalid deeds.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Williams, Jr. of Baltimore, was read the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act for the relief of John Norris, and Caleb Pue, of Harford county, being entitled to a third reading, was, on motion of Mr. Montgomery, ordered to lie on the table.
