A bill, entitled, an act to regulate sales of real estate, by collectors of taxes in the several counties and cities in this state, except Baltimore county, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, to provide for the payment of jurors of Harford county, passed at December session, 1826, chapter 103, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill, entitled, an act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to alter the grade of Calvert street in said city; which was read the first time and referred to

Messrs. Mayer, Hughlett and Taney.

A bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Washington county, to raise a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Sappington and Montgomery.
