

1. In the second line of the fourteenth section, after the word, "resign," insert the words, "refuse to act."

2. In the fourth line of the fourteenth section, after the word, "place," insert the words, "who shall at the time of his appointment, and during his continuance in office, reside in Allegany county and;"

The bill was then read through, and the question was put, "Shall the bill be engrossed for a third reading;?" and it was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee to which was referred the resolutions, requesting the Senators and Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, to use their exertions to procure appropriations for the establishment and support of proper Buoys at the entrances of the Rivers Nanticoke, Manokin, Annemessix, Pocomoke and Wicomico, in the collection districts of Snowhill and Vienna, reported, that the committee had had the said resolutions under consideration, and were of opinion they ought to be assented to, with the following amendment, which was read and adopted:

Strike out the whole of the first resolution, to the word, "use" in the third line, and in lieu thereof, insert the words, "our Senators in Congress be instructed, and our Representatives requested to;" the resolutions were then read the second time.

Mr. Mayer presented the memorial of John Robinson and others, praying an act of Incorporation, as a Savings Institution; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Dennis and Wootton.

Mr. Mayer presented the petition of John A. Stanbury, praying relief as an Insolvent debtor; which was read, and referred to the committee on Insolvency.

Mr. Mayer presented the memorial of William Patterson, Robert Oliver and others, relative to the evils of the sale, by retail of spirituous liquors, as now authorised by law; which was read, and referred to the committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, leave was given to bring in a bill, to be entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to Incorporate Companies to make several Turnpike Roads through Baltimore county and for other purposes, passed on the 12th January, 1805, chapter 51;

Ordered, that Messrs. Mayer, Montgomery and Taney, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The bill, entitled, an act supplementary to the act, entitled, "An act to establish a House of Refuge for Juvenile Delinquents;" was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
