

Wheeling Transportation Company; reported that the committee had had the said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments, which were read and assented to.

Between the words "Virginia" and "and" in the 4th line of the 12 section insert the words "through the counties of Frederick and Washington, and the Town of Cumberland in Allegany county Maryland"

2. In the 6th line of the same section between the words "transportation" and "by" insert the words "as aforesaid."

The bill was then progressing in its second reading, when Mr. Dennis moved the following amendment, which was read and assented to: strike out the word "his" in the last line of the 1st section and insert the words "of the one so dying or refusing to act."

Mr. Sappington moved the following amendment, which was read and assented to, strike out the word "until" in the 2nd line of the 10th section, and insert the words "at the time of." The bill was then read through the second time.

Mr. Claude from the committee, to which was referred, the bill, entitled, an act to amend the Charter of the City of Annapolis, and to exempt the property in the said City belonging to the corporation thereof from the payment of county taxes, reported favorably on said bill, it was then read the second time.

Mr. Taney submitted the following message, which was read and adopted.

By the Senate,

January 17, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing that a committee on the part of the Senate, be appointed to co-operate with the committee of grievances and courts of justice appointed by your house, to take into consideration the condition of the colored population in this state, and concur therein.

We have appointed Messrs. Taney, Emory, Dennis, Wootton and Pigman, to meet said committee on that subject.
