Mr. Mayer, from the committee, to which was referred the bill, entitled, an act to encourage the destruction of crows in this State, reported, that the committee had had the said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendments:

After the words "Prince George's" in the last line of the bill, insert the words "Frederick, Washington and Allegany."

Add the following as an additional section:

"And be it enacted, That all laws inconsistent with the provisions of this act be, and the same are hereby repealed;" which amendments were read, and the question was put, "will the Senate adopt the amendment, proposing to insert the words Frederick, Washington and Allegany;" it was determined in the negative.

The question was then put, "will the Senate adopt the amendment, proposing an additional section?" and it was determined in the affirmative. The bill was then read the se-

eond time.

Mr. Mayer, from the committee, to which was referred a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Mechanic's Savings Fund Society of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon. was then read the second time.

read and adopted:

At the end of the 1st. section, add the following proviso: "provided that the said Baltimore and Pitston Coal Company, shall not at any time hereafter purchase or hold by selling and exchange more estates, real or personal, than
