The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, January 24th, 1832.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to authorise the Governor and Council of Maryland, to appoint the inspectors of Flour in this state, passed at December session, 1825, chapter 174; was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading
