

Mr. Dennis, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred a resolution, authorising the Governor and Council to settle the account of Joseph A. Lewis

A resolution requiring the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay to his order a certain sum of money therein mentioned. And

A resolution in favor of John I Jacob, reported that the committee had had said resolutions under consideration, and were of opinion they ought to be assented to. They were then severally read the second time.

Mr. Sappington, from the committee, to which was re-committed the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled and act to establish a bank, and incorporate a company, under the name of the Frederick County Bank, reported favorably thereon. It was then read the second time.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee on Invalid Deeds, to which was referred the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Anne Arundel county court, to record the deeds therein mentioned, reported, that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment which were read and assented to:

Strike out the proviso in the 3d section of the bill, and in lieu thereof, insert the following proviso:

“Provided that nothing in this act shall effect the title of a purchaser purchasing the estate mentioned in said deed or deeds, after the date of said deeds, without notice of said deed or deeds, and provided that it shall not affect the creditors of the said grantor or grantors trusting said grantors or either of them after the date of said deeds, and prior to the time of their being recorded ”

The bill was then read the second time.

Mr. Mayer presented the petition of Benjamin Taylor, and others, praying an act of incorporation, which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Taney and Sappington.

Mr. Sappington presented the petition of William Eury of Frederick county, praying certain relief, which was read and referred to the committee on invalid deeds.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the resolution requiring the Treasurer of the Western Shore to pay to his Excellency the Governor, or to his order, a certain sum of money therein mentioned, was read the third time by special order
