On motion of Mr. Dennis, the resolution authorising the governor and council to settle the account of Joseph N. Lewis; was read the third time by special order and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the resolution in favor of John I. Jacob; was read the third time by special order and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Sappington, the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the governor and council of Maryland, to appoint the inspectors of flour of this state, passed at December session, 1825, chapter 174; was by special order taken up for consideration, and whilst progressing in the third reading,

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendment was read and assented to:

Insert the following as the 6th section of the bill :

“And be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act, the several inspectors of Flour in this State, shall on the head of every cask of Flour inspected by them brand their respective names, and the name of the Town or City where the said inspection shall be made.”

The bill was then read through the third time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Wootton, the preamble and resolutions relative to free persons of color, was made the order of the day for to-morrow; (Wednesday, the 25th inst.)

The bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act relating to actions of replevis, was taken up for consideration; And

On motion of Mr. Dennis, ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Sappington,

The bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to establish a bank, and incorporate a company, under the name of the Frederick County Bank; was read the third time by special order and passed.
