

WEDNESDAY, January 25th, 1832.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution authorising the Governor and Council to settle the account of Joseph N. Lewis.

The resolution requiring the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay his Excellency the Governor, or to his order a certain sum of money therein mentioned. And

A resolution in favor of John I. Jacob, severally assented to by the Senate on yesterday; And

The bill, entitled an act for the shutting up of a certain part of Forrest Street extended, in the city of Baltimore.

The bill, entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Montgomery and Frederick counties.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Dorchester county court, to record a deed from Hugh Neild and James Neild to William Dorsey.

The bill, entitled, an act to provide for building a Bridge over Patapsco Falls, at, or near the Thistle Factory.

The bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Carmelite Sisters of Baltimore.

The bill, entitled, an act to alter and change the location of part of the second and third election districts, in Dorchester county.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Harford county court, to record the deeds therein mentioned.

And the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to establish a Bank, and Incorporate a Company, under the name of the Frederick County Bank.

Also, severally passed by the Senate on yesterday, were returned; And

The bill, entitled a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to authorise the governor and council of Maryland, to appoint inspectors of Flour for this State, passed, at December session, 1825, chapter 174; was sent to the house of delegates.
