A resolution relative to the Laws of different States and Territories; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Claude and Chapman

Also, the following bills:

A bill, entitled, an act appointing commissioners to fix on a scite for a bridge over Deer Creek, in Harford county, at, or near Death's Ford or Wilson's mill, at some scite between said places, and to authorise a levy, not exceeding one thousand dollars for the purpose of erecting the same; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Taney, Claude and Emory.

A bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to provide for the collection of the public revenue, passed at December session, 1829 chapter 90; which was read the

first time, and referred to the committee on Finance.
