By the Senate,

January 26, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing to proceed with the election of bank directors on the part of the state this day at 12 o'clock. The hour having passed as fixed in your message, we propose with your concurrence to proceed at 12 o'clock to-morrow with said election. In addition to the nomination made by your house we nominate on the part of the Senate, Thomas Mummy for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, one of the present directors. We have appointed Messrs. Hughlett and Taney to join the gentlemen named by you.

The resolution directing the clerk of the Senate to record the proceedings of the electors of the Senate of Maryland, was read the third time by special order, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

And being accordingly engrossed,

On motion of Mr. Sappington it was read the third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Washington Hose Company of Baltimore, was read the third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Dennis,

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the guardian of the heirs of Isaac Mitchell to convey to Mary P. Mitchell their right, title and interest in a piece of land therein mentioned,
