

cases during the period aforesaid in the same manner and subject to the same regulations as is now provided or allowed in reference to the summons and attendance and service of jurors for trials at said terms.

And be it enacted, That all parts of any acts of Assembly inconsistent with the provision of this act, be and they are hereby repealed.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled, an act to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners, and extend the time for making the roads therein mentioned, in Baltimore county, reported favorably thereon.

It was then read the second time.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following message; which was read and adopted, to wit:

By the Senate.

January 30th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates.

We have received your message, proposing to proceed to-morrow at 12 o'clock, to the election of a Bank Director on the part of the State in the Farmer's and Merchant's Bank of Baltimore and accede thereto.

No other gentleman is put in nomination by the Senate in addition to the gentleman named by your honorable body. Messrs. Hughlett and Emory are appointed to join the gentlemen named by you to count the ballots and report thereon.
