encourage, and these are, primary schools, academies and

colleges.

Upon this interesting subject your committee is aware that the narrow limits of this report will not permit the attempt at a just exposition, and it will content itself by expressing the belief that no exertion to further the patriotic and beneficent objects of education, can be too great, and hardly any sacrifices too onerous, to merit the calm, the serious, and the earnest consideration of the legislature.

The bill, entitled, an act relating to appeals and writs of error on judgments of the county courts, was read the third time, and on motion of Mr. Dennis ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Josiah Bayley, reported favorably thereon.

It was then read the second, and by special order the
