

vice of the State, and died while in such service; which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Finance.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, passed the 12th day of January 1805, chapter 51; being entitled to a third reading, was taken up for consideration, and whilst progressing in the reading;

Mr. Pigman offered the following amendment, which was read and assented to. to wit:

In the 2nd section after the word "road," insert the words "or any other turnpike road company in this state."

On motion of Mr. Pigman, the said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, an act to provide for the payment of jurors in Baltimore county without the limits of the city; was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which the leave was referred, reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act relating to certain books and records in the orphans court of Baltimore, passed at December session 1830, chapter 70; which was read the first, and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following message, which was read, adopted and with the resolution to which it refers, sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate,

February 2, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have rejected the resolution in favor of the legal representatives or administrators of Benjamin Howard, a soldier of the revolutionary war, granting a common warrant for fifty acres of vacant land, lying in Allegany county, and an order for issuing a patent for the said quantity of acres of land, upon a certificate of the survey thereof, duly returned, without requiring payment or the proof of payment, or any composition money therefor, because the said resolution extends to the administrators, and we conceive it should be confined to his heirs or devisees.
