

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act to revive and extend the charter of the Planters' Bank of Prince Georges' county, so as to enable the institution, gradually to wind up its affairs, being entitled to a third reading, was taken up for consideration and whilst progressing in the reading,

Mr. Pigman offered the following amendment which was read to wit:

Strike out the 3rd section of the bill.

Mr. Wootton from the committee on Internal Improvement, to which was referred the bill, entitled, an act to authorise and empower the commissioners of Cecil county, to build a bridge over the big North East creek, at or near William Phillip's in said county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments, which were read and assented to:
