scribed to them if the legislature have the authority to act with such absolute effect.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Warren Manufacturing Company; which

was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer presented the petition of Columbus O'Donnell and John Merryman, praying to be heard by counsel on the subject of the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the War-

ren Manufacturing Company.

On motion of Mr. Wootton, the amendments reported with the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from near Ellicott's Lower Mills towards Georgetown, in the District of Columbia, were read the second time and assented to.

The bill was then read the second time, and by special or-

der the third time, and passed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relating to the obstructions in the Susquehanna river, which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Pigman and Emory.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act providing for the inspection of sole leather, and rough harness and rough skirting leather, in the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Chapman and Hughlett.

A bill antitled, a further supplement to the act of December session 1827, chapter 111, entitled, an act to regulate sales by public auction; which was read the first time and

referred to the committee on finance.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Chesapeake Steam Saw Mill Company; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Page and Wootton.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to allow Adam Robb, executor of Upton Beall, late clerk of Montgomery county, further time to complete certain records passed at December session 1828, chapter 2; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Mayer and Pigman.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Joseph Fogle, of he state of Kentucky, a lunatic; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Mayer and Page.

A bill entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of asembly which would expire with the present session; which
