Mr. Mayer submitted the following message which was read the first time.

By the Senate,

Feb. 3, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We beg leave to present for your consideration, the propriety of authorising the chairman of either of the committees to whom the memorial of several Banks in the city of Baltimore was refered, to call on any of the incorporated banks in said city, or the officers thereof; and on the Treasurer of the Western Shore, and on the officers of the road companies therein named, for such information, as may be in their possession, and may be deemed necessary by said committees, or either of the chairman thereof, in their investigations.

We submit this matter to the consideration of your honorable body, as no resolutions for such authorisations can constitutionally originate in the senate.

The senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.
