Mr. Chapman, from the committee on finance, to which was referred a resolution in favor of Charles E. Tilden, and a resolution in favor of Jacob C. Wilson, reported favorably thereon they were then severally read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

By the Senate,

February 6, 1832;

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing the appointment of a joint committee of five persons, to visit the Penitentiary, and to examine and report the state and condition of that institution, and concur therein. We have appointed on
