

TUESDAY, February 7, 1832.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Reid, Mr. Osborn and Mr. Montgomery appeared in the senate chamber.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Joseph Fogle, of the state of Kentucky, a lunatic, which passed the senate with certain amendments on yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to which was referred a resolution in favor of John I. Jacob; a resolution in favor of Sarah Auld; a resolution in favor of the heirs of Benjamin Howard; and a resolution in favor of George Ireland deceased, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second time.

Mr. Hughlett from the said committee to which was referred a resolution requiring the treasurer of the Western Shore to pay Reubin Ross in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private; and a resolution in favor of Adam Hoops of Waterleit, state of New York, reported that the committee had had said resolutions under consideration, and were of opinion they ought not to be assented to.

They were then severally read the second time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following bills to wit

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the grand lodge of the state of Maryland of the independant order of Odd Fellows, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Dennis and Wootton.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baers Chymical Works of Baltimore; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs Mayer, Chapman and Pigman.

A bill, entitled, an act authorising the Levy court of Worcester county, to levy on the assessable property of said county, a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis Reid and Osborn.

A bill, entitled, an act authorising the Levy court of Frederick county at their discretion, to levy a sum of money to erect a bridge over Linganore Creek; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Emory and Page.
