Mr. Mayer presented the petition of Catharine Little, for liberty to lease out certain ground in Baltimore, which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Reid and Sappington.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled, an act to divorce John Banks, and Mary his wife, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second time.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the resolution authorising the Treasurer to pay his excellency the governor, fifty dollars, being the amount paid by him for a horse pressed into the service of the state, and died while in such service, reported favorably thereon.

It was then read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee to which was referred a resolution relative to the laws of different states and territories, reported favorably thereon.

It was then read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee to which was referred the resolution relating to the Free School Fund, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to be dissented from.

It was then read the second, and by special order the third time, and dissented from.
