

The bills delivered yesterday by the clerk of the house of delegates, were taken up for consideration, and were as follows:

A bill, entitled, an act to exempt a part of Holland Street, in the city of Baltimore, from the operation of the 16th section of the act of 1817, chapter 148, entitled, an act relating to the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Montgomery and Osborn.

A bill, entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act to provide for repairs of public roads in Montgomery county, passed at December session, 1826, chapter 227; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Emory and Claude.

A bill, entitled, an act, further supplemental to the act of December session, 1827, chapter 111, entitled, an act to regulate sales by public auction; which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Finance.

The bill, entitled, an act to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners, and extend the time for making certain roads therein mentioned, in Baltimore county; was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett, from the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Mary Eason, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, reported favorably thereon.

It was then read the second time.

Mr. Mayer, presented the petition of Horatio G. Jamieson and others, praying the incorporation of a Medical College, in the city of Baltimore; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Claude and Pigman.

Mr. Mayer, presented the petition of Charles S. Davis, praying certain relief; which was read, and referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Mr. Mayer, presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore, relative to the appointment of an additional Inspector of Flour; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Pigman and Hughlett.

Mr. Mayer, presented the petition of Joseph Todhunter and others, of Baltimore, relative to widening German Lane; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Reid and Wootton.
