The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates, delivered a letter from James Sangston, tendering his resignation as Register of Wills, for Caroline county.

Also, a resolution, in favor of Thomas Haywood; which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was recommit-
ted the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Chesapeake Steam Saw-mill company, reported that the committee had had said bill again under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amend-
ments; which were read and assented to:

In the 2nd line of the 3rd section, strike out the word "one" before "thousand" and insert "two."

In the 12th line of the 4th section, between the words "body" and "either," insert the words "or in the place of president."

The bill was then read the second time.

The bill entitled, an act to regulate the sales of real estate by collectors of tax in the several counties and cities in this state; was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs and devisees of Stephen Raphael, the elder, was read the third time, by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington submitted the following report; which was read and concurred in.

The committee appointed on the part of the Senate to make arrangements for the celebration of the Centennial Anniversary of the birth of Washington, in conjunction with a similar committee on the part of the House of Delegates, beg leave to report the following order of proceedings for that day;

First. The legislature to adjourn over from the 21st to the 23rd inst.

Second. A Federal salute to be fired at sunrise.
