

Third. The United States flag to be displayed throughout the day.

Fourth. A National Salute to be fired at noon.

Fifth. A prayer by the Reverend Chaplain of the Senate

Sixth. Washington's Farewell address, to be read by the Speaker of the House of Delegates.

Seventh. An Oration to be delivered by the honorable Littleton Purnell Dennis of the Senate.

Eighth. A prayer by the Reverend Chaplain of the House of Delegates.

Ninth. A Federal salute to be fired at sunset.

The reading of the Valedictory, and the delivery of the Oration to be in the hall of the Senate; that being the chamber, in which the Illustrious Father of the Republic resigned his Military Commission.

On this occasion, the portrait of Washington and his two Aids, will be taken from the hall of the Delegates, to that of the Senate, and placed behind the Orator.
