Mr. Emory submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

February 10, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing to go into the election of a Register of Wills, for Caroline county, this day at 1 o'clock, and concur therein.

On the part of the Senate, Messrs. Emory and Mayer are appointed to join those gentlemen named in your message,

to count the ballots and report the result.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill, entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled an act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of Assembly therein mentioned; was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, an act to Incorporate the United States Insurance Company of Baltimore; was read the third time,

and passed.

One o'clock having arrived, the Senate proceeded to the election of a Register of Wills, for Caroline county. The ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, sealed up, and delivered to Messrs. Emory and Mayer, the committee appointed to meet the committee of the house of delegates to count the ballots and report the result.

They retired to the conference room, and after some time returned and reported, that there were 82 votes taken in all; of which, William A. Ford had 72 votes, Duff Green 6 votes, .

William Orrell 2 votes, and that there were 2 blanks.

Whereupon it was declared in the Senate, that William A. Ford is duly elected to be recommended to the governor and council to be commissioned as Register of Wills for Caroline county.
