On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers, was taken up for consideration, and whilst progressing in the second reading,

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendments were read assented to.

In the 5th line of the 4th section, strike out the words "or other interests."

In the 8th line of the 4th section, after the word "assured," insert "and from and after the time and not before, when a conveyance or demise, according to the terms and condition of such instruments shall or may be claimable at law or in equity."

On motion of Mr. Dennis the question was put "will the House strike out the 4th section?"
