The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Conococheague Bank in Williamsport, in Washington county, passed at December session 1819, chapter 142.

Ordered, That Messrs. Pigman, Chapman and Dennis, prepare and report the same.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled an act for the inspection of lumber in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment; which was read and assented to.

Strike out the 3d section.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution requesting the governor to forward to the executive of each of the several states and territories, the resolutions of this general assembly proposing exchanges of the laws and reports of their respective states and territories; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Chapman, Mayer and Claude.

A resolution in favor of Margaret King; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Frederick and Baltimore counties; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Mayer and Pigman.

And returned the bill, which originated in the senate, entitled, an act supplementary to the act entitled, an act to establish a house of refuge for juvenile delinquents, endorsed "will not pass"
