It was then read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act for the relief of John Childs, of Anne-Arundel county, passed at December session, 1830, chapter 172; was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.
