On motion of Mr. Claude, the following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, That Messrs. Claude and Chapman inform the Speaker and Members of the House of Delegates, that the Governor is attending in the Senate Chamber, ready to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and invite their attendance to witness the same.

Whereupon the speaker attended by the members of the house of delegates appeared in the senate chamber, when the engrossed bills from No. 1 to No. 95 inclusive, were presented by the speaker of the house of delegates to his excellency Governor Howard, who signed and affixed the great seal of the state to the same in the presence of both houses of assembly, according to the provisions of the constitution and form of government.

The honorable speaker and members of the house of delegates then retired from the senate chamber.

The senate adjourned until to morrow morning 10 o'clock.
