The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the fol-

lowing bills:

A bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a wood corder in the town of Princess Anne, in Somerset county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Page and Reid.

A bill entitled, an act to change the name of Lewis Hunt, of Baltimore county, into the name of Lewis Cockey Hunt; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. May-

er, Pigman and Sappington.

A bill entitled, an act relating to coroners; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Page, Hughlett

and Claude.

Mr Pigman from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province, and limiting the extent of them; which was read the first time

Mr. Dennis from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to appoint a wood corder in the town of Princess Anne, in Somerset county, reported favorably

, thereon.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time and passed.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, Feb. 21th, 1832.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday except Mr. Taney. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a wood corder in the Town of Princes-Anne in Somerset county, passed by the senate on yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman presented the petition of Mary A. Reynolds of Allegany county, praying certain relief; which was read and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Page and Dennis.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act for erecting a bridge
