In the 3d section 4th line after the word "Baltimore" add the words "Provided nevertheless, that the state of Maryland reserves to itself the right to modify, amend or rescind any provisions in this act at any time after the expiration of the year 1845, which modification, amendment or rescision shall in the opinion of the legislature, further the objects and designs contemplated by this act of incorporation."

The bill was then read through, and the question was put.
