

And the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Chesapeake Steam Saw Mill Company, also passed by the senate on yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer presented the petition of George Ellicott and others, praying for a repeal of the act passed at the present session for the relief of Allen Thomas, of Anne Arundel county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Claude, Dennis and Sappington.
