

The bill was then read through.

And the question was put,
"Shall the bill pass?"

It was determined in the affirmative, and the bill was returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of Catharine Grove,

A resolution in favor of Elizabeth White,

And a resolution in favor of William L. Barnard, of Kentucky; which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a resolution in favor of William Riley and others.

And a resolution in favor of the Rev. Mr. Guest and the Rev. Mr. Blanchard; which were severally read and referred to the committee on finance.

Also a resolution in favor of Lieutenant Benjamin Seegur; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the militia.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Frederick Fire Insurance Company; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Hughlett and Mayer.

A bill entitled, an act to lay out and make a public road in Kent county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Osborn, Emory and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Marsham Queen, of Charles county; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of William H. Garner, of Charles county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Claude, Montgomery and Sappington.

A bill entitled, an act to provide for the rebuilding a certain bridge therein mentioned; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, an act to provide for the cession of territorial jurisdiction at Turkey Point, in Cecil county, for the erection of a light house by the government of the United States; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Dennes and Osborn.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act relating to a public road in Montgomery county, passed at December session 1830, chapter 112; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.
