Mr. Sappington from said committee reported that the committee had had said bill again under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments; which were read and assented to:

In the 4th line of the 2d section strike out the word "twelve" and insert the word "six"

In the last line of said section strike out the word. "twelve" and insert the word "six."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on insolvency, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Joseph Larned, of the city of Washington, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order, the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the follow-mg resolutions:

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the occlusion of part of Emory street in the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Montgomery and Chapman.

A bill entitled, an act relating to the duties of the levy court of Montgomery county; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, an act to provide for the more speedy payment of Jurors in Queen Ann's county, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs Emory, Chapman and Sappington;

And returned the following bill which originated in the

A bill entitled, an act, supplementary to the act, entitled, an act to establish a house of refuge for Juvinile Delinquents.
