The bill entitled, an act relating to landlords and tenants, was taken up for consideration.

The amendments heretofore offered were read the second

time and assented to.

The bill was then progressing in the second reading,

On motion of Mr. Wootton, the following amendment was

read and assented to:

In the 8th line of the 1st section, after the word "session" strike out the remainder of the section.

The bill was then read through the second, and by special. order the third time passed, and returned to the house

of delegates.

The clerk of the bouse of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Mrs. Mary C. Shryer, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a bill entitled; an act to incorporate the Elkton and Baltimore rail road company, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled an act supplementary to an act passed at December session 1827, chapter 183, entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to erect Baltimore town in Baltimore county into a city and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, endorsed "will not pass."

Mr. Emory from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to regulate joint fences in Queen Anne's county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments; which were read and assented to:

In the 2nd line of the bill, after the words "Queen Anne's" strike out the word "county," and insert "and Talbot coun-

ties."

Amend the title of the bill by striking out the word "county," and inserting the words "and Talbot counties."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
